Seven Scholarships Recently Endowed

The local scholarship committee was kept plenty busy during the past three months, as a total of seven new perpetual scholarships were set up with the non-profit organization.

These new scholarships are titled: Class of 1965 Scholarship, Class of 2011 Scholarship, Everett and Jan Brandenburg Family Scholarship, George and Arna Gabrielson Family Scholarship, Jerry Benson Scholarship, John and Henrietta Top Memorial Scholarship, and the Tangeman Family Scholarship.

Printed below is a short synopsis regarding each of these endowments.

Class of 1965 Scholarship

Several years ago the Class of 1965 launched a campaign to establish a scholarship of its name. Class leaders sought gifts for and suggested memorials be directed to the Dollars for Scholars program.

Perseverance paid off. During the fall of 2010 the class not only reached its goal, but exceeded its goal of \$2,000.

The first Class of 1965 Scholarship will be awarded this May.

Class of 2011 Scholarship

The Class of 2011 scholarship follows a similar pattern that began with the Class of 2004.

It was Norm Torrison, '50, Long Lake, Minn., who challenged the Class of 2004 to match his gift of \$1,000 and establish a scholarship in that class' name.

The same challenge was issued by Norm Torrison to the Class of '05, '06, '07, and '08, and each challenge was accepted and met. Then Norm stopped making those challenges.

But, starting with the Class of '09, the challenge was reversed. The Class of '09 issued a challenge to Norm Torrison, challenging him to match a class gift of \$1,000 to Luverne Dollars for Scholars organization. Norm Torrison cheerfully accepted and honored its challenge.

The Class of '10, and now the Class of '11, also challenged Norm Torrison, making it possible for each class to establish a scholarship in its own name.

These eight individual class scholarships, starting with the Class of 2004 through the Class of 2011, have Norm Torrison's fingerprints on them.


The first Class of 2011 Scholarship will be presented to a member of that class in May.

Everett and Jan Brandenburg Family Scholarship

Neither Everett nor Jan Brandenburg graduated from Luverne High School, but their two children did.

Both Everett and Jan graduated from Magnolia High School—Everett in 1953 and Jan in 1954. And their children, Lori Brandenburg Bisek and Lynn Brandenburg Bisek, graduated in 1975 and 1976, respectively.

While Everett and Jan reside in Luverne, their two daughters live and work in New Prague, Minnesota. Lori works in the New Prague school system and Lynn works for a pharmacy.



The Brandenburg family recognizes the value of and the importance for a good education. And by establishing this scholarship, they are pleased to be able to help a young person better their life through the pursuit of an education.

Because of the respect the family has for education and the health care profession, whenever possible this scholarship will be awarded to an individual wishing to pursue an occupation in either the sciences or health care fields.

The first Brandenburg Family Scholarship will be awarded in May.

George and Arna Gabrielson Family Scholarship

The George and Arna Gabrielson Family Scholarship was established shortly after George's death, which occurred nearly a year ago, May 21, 2010.

George, born in 1917, was a lifelong resident of Rock County. On the other hand, Arna, his wife, was not. She was born in Norway and immigrated to the United States at the young age of two.

Although each would start their formal schooling in different years, they already had something in common at that young age. Both attended a one-room country school and neither knew a single word of English.

In 1937 George graduated from LHS. Three years later, in 1940, Arna crossed the stage to receive her LHS diploma.

In the late '30's, George joined the Army National Guard. With America being drawn into World War II, George, with his local guard unit, went off to Kodiak, Alaska, serving there until the war's end.

In 1949, George married Arna Helle. The couple farmed throughout their married life. In addition to farming, George worked as an agent for Farmers Union Insurance.

During their life together, George and Arna loved to travel. They also enjoyed spending time with their family and, as one would expect, were very proud of their Norwegian heritage.

George and Arna are parents of two children: Linda Gabrielson Smith, '68, Greenfield, Massachusetts, and Lona Gabrielson Klosterbuer, '70, Luverne—both are Luverne graduates.

George was extremely pleased that each of his six grandchildren obtained college degrees. He was also fond of the Dollars for Scholars program, its phenomenal growth,

Jerry Benson Scholarship

Jerry Benson, a current LHS faculty member, launched his teaching career in the fall of 1970 with Magnolia Public School. Several years later, in 1994, when the Magnolia School merged into the Luverne school, the merger brought Jerry into the Luverne school system.

During his 40-plus year teaching career, Jerry touched many young lives. His influence occurred in both the classroom and in the many extra curricular activities he supervised. In Magnolia, he was associated with the football, basketball, and baseball programs; and in Luverne he worked with speech, Knowledge Bowl, and Mock Trial.

Later in his career, Jerry became very ill. In 2010, Jerry's colleagues and former students, showing a great respect, held a benefit to help him pay for his accumulated medical bills. However, the special fund raiser was so successful, the residue of those benefit dollars were used to established a scholarship in his name.

It is the wish of Jerry Benson, who is currently working as social studies instructor, to award this scholarship to a student with aspirations of entering the field of education.

The first Jerry Benson Scholarship will be presented in May.

John and Henrietta Top Memorial Scholarship

With the passing of Henrietta Top, family members established this scholarship in memory of their parents and grandparents.

John Top was a lifelong resident of Rock County. On February 11, 1948, he married Henrietta Brouwer at her parents' home in Lyon County, Iowa. Together, the Tops farmed their entire married life within the Luverne school district.

At the young age of 60, a massive heart attack in 1980 claimed John's life. Thirty years later, on Christmas Day, 2010, Henrietta passed away.

At the time of Henrietta's death, she was a resident in the Mary Jane Brown Home, where in her later years she had been coping with Alzheimer's disease.

The Tops were parents of two children: Glenda Top Schomacker (husband LeRoy) and Steve Top (wife Shirley). Both Glenda and Steve are graduates of LHS, graduating in '69 and '76, respectively.

John and Henrietta's grandchildren— Shelly Schomacker Jepsen, '90, Valentine, Nebraska; Sara Schomacker Sprock, '94, George, Iowa.; Jon Schomacker, '98, Luverne; Stacy Top Schepel, Luverne, '00; and Amber

Top, '02, Brandon, South Dakota—are also LHS graduates.

Because of the special care Henrietta received in the later years of her life, whenever possible the family requests the scholarship recipient be an individual who worked for or who currently works at the Mary Jane Brown Home.

The first John and Henrietta Top Memorial Scholarship will be awarded this May.

Tangeman Family Scholarship

Arthur John Tangeman, Jr., '38, Landisburg, Pennsylvania, upon reading the last issue of the *Alumni News*, felt the urgency to establish a scholarship in his family's name.

Says Arthur, Jr., "I am 90 years old and my favorite lines these days are 'I would rather be seen than viewed' and 'My next toothpaste purchase will be a lifetime supply'."

He went on to say that, "I have . . . over the minimum I project for my will and think the Tangeman family imprint on Rock County should be remembered."

In early March, Arthur, Jr., endowed a scholarship in honor and memory of the Tangeman family. His endowment has been named The Tangeman Family Scholarship.

Arthur, Jr., says his grandparents, Andrew Jackson and Julia Bratsburg Tangeman were the first of the Tangemans to immigrate to Rock County.

Both grandparents were born in Iowa, grandfather Andrew in 1866 and grandmother Julia in 1869. Sometime after their marriage, these two individuals left Iowa, making their first Minnesota home in Waseca. Soon after they move to Rock County.

When they did arrive in Rock County, they first settled in Beaver Creek, where they opened a general merchandise store. In 1905 they moved their business into the village of Hardwick. In 1912, they had a two-story frame building erected, using the second story for apartments. Their business seemed to flourish, as they eventually purchased a half-section farm north of Hardwick and later, a half-section farm east of Luverne.

Andrew's brother, George, who was living in Michigan at the time, moved to southwest Minnesota and operated the Luverne farm site. George passed away on April 4, 1960.

According to Arthur, Jr., in 1937, Andrew retired. He closed his Hardwick store and moved to Adrian.


Second Tangeman Generation—

Andrew and Julia were the parents of two children: Verra and Arthur John. Arthur John would eventually become Arthur, Sr.

Verra, born in 1894, married late in life. Verra graduated from Carlton College and taught music in Minnesota and Michigan. It is believed that Verra passed away in October, 1974, in Mesa, Arizona.

Arthur, Sr., was born in 1896. He married Dorothy Whyte on March 12, 1919. Dorothy was the daughter of Hardwick physician Dr. Peter Duncan Whyte. Incidentally,

Dr. Whyte's wife, Bertha Hodges Whyte, was the local pharmacist. Because of her position, and as one might expect, she provided support for her husband's practice.

There is some evidence that Arthur, Sr., for a period

of time, served as the proprietor of his parents' thriving Hardwick business.

Eventually, Arthur, Sr., and his wife, Dorothy, left Hardwick. Their move took them to St. Paul. In this city, Arthur, Sr., worked for the Jacob Schmidt Brewing Company. He headed up the brewery's Sales and Marketing division. It is believed that this move to St. Paul occurred sometime after 1941.

Third Tangeman Generation—

Arthur, Sr., and Dorothy, were the parents of three children: Arthur John, Jr., Robert Gordon, and Andrew Francis. Their children were born in 1920, 1924, and 1930, respectively.

Arthur, Jr., graduated from LHS in 1938. Three years later, in 1941, Robert Gordon received his LHS diploma. It is believed that the youngest child, Andrew Francis, graduated from a Twin Cities' high school.

Arthur, Jr., as noted earlier, lives in Pennsylvania. Like so many young men around the time of World War II, Arthur, Jr., was a member of the local Army National Guard and eventually was sent with his unit to Kodiak, Alaska. Apparently, Arthur, Jr., spent his livelihood in the communications field, working for the State Department in Washington, D.C., until his retirement. Arthur, Jr.'s, reason for retirement: "I worked with antiquated computers from 1965 'til I retired in 1975, just to get away from the computer."

Robert Gordon, the second son, left the area for a period of time, but eventually moved back to Luverne where he and his wife, Janet, currently reside.

It is not clear as to where Andrew Francis, the third son, resides, but it is believed that he calls Palm Harbour, Florida, home.

This is just a short story about the Tangeman family, as there is more that could be written about this Rock County family. **(See page 14 for information Arthur shared)**

The Tangeman Family imprint on Rock County begins next month, when the first Tangeman Family Scholarship will be presented for the first time, and then continues each additional year thereafter, forever.

Let's just hope the next time Arthur John Tangeman, Jr., goes shopping for toothpaste, he brings a truck and purchases enough tubes to last him for at least ten years.

(NOTE: For many who recognize the Tangeman name but not necessarily the name of Arthur, Jr., then you may be more familiar with this benefactor by his nickname, "Tim" Tangeman.)

Record High Scholarship Dollars to be Awarded

This year Luverne Dollars for Scholars will be awarding a total of \$170,950 in scholarships to 54 qualifying LHS graduates in the Class of 2011. This is the largest dollar amount ever granted to a single class.

Over the past 28 years, Luverne Dollars for Scholars has awarded a total of more than \$1.9 million to nearly 1,337 LHS graduates.

The long-term goal of Luverne Dollars for Scholars is to grant \$4,000 and \$8,000 scholarships to LHS graduates, disseminating \$2,000 on a yearly basis to assist LHS graduates with their 2- or 4-year post secondary education expenses.

Since December 1983, the Luverne Dollars for Scholars program has been the benefactor of more than 185 perpetual scholarships and has been entrusted with a total endowment of slightly more than \$6 million.

The Class of 2011 is the 28th LHS graduating class to benefit from the Luverne Dollars for Scholars program.

Luverne Dollars for Scholars is a non-profit community-based scholarship program which was officially initiated on December 6, 1983. The sole purpose of the program is to raise money and to disperse this money in the form of scholarships to Luverne High School graduates.

The success of the Luverne Dollars for Scholars program is attributed to the many generous LHS graduates who have established perpetual scholarships with the local scholarship program.
