LHS announces first class of Alumni Hall of Fame inductees

The first group of inductees into the new Luverne High School Alumni Hall of Fame have been named by the Hall of Fame committee.

The Class of 2023 includes six individuals and one team. In alphabetical order, the honorees include:

•The players, coaches and manager of the **1964 state championship basketball team.**

The team brought statewide fame to Luverne during an era when there was only one class of competition, there were no girls' sports, and the state basketball tournament was the most focused-on high school sports event in Minnesota.

•Quentin Aanenson, Class of 1939. Aanenson was a celebrated World War II fighter pilot whose first combat mission was during D-Day in 1944. He was featured in the nationally known documentaries, "A Fighter Pilot's Story" and the Ken Burns series, "The War."

•Jim Brandenburg, Class of 1963. Brandenburg is an internationally known nature photographer. He was a contract

•Jerilyn Britz, Class of 1961. A professional golfer for 26 years, Britz won the Ladies Professional Golf Association (LPGA) tour in 1979 and was the first woman inducted into the Rock County Hall of Fame.

•Warren Herreid, Sr., Class of 1938. Herreid had a distinguished 41-year career with the Minnesota National Guard. He was instrumental in founding Luverne's "Last Man's Club," the Rock County

Music Boosters starts perpetual scholarship in Dolly Talbert's memory

Luverne Music Boosters is starting a perpetual scholarship with Luverne Dollars for Scholars in memory of longtime school music director Dolly Talbert, who died June 7 in Luverne at the age of 85.

Mrs. Talbert moved to Luverne in 1970 with her husband, Don, and taught vocal and instrumental music in Luverne Public Schools where she was named "Teacher of the Year in 1989. She retired in 1993, but her dedication to music continued long past her retirement.

In addition to teaching private piano lessons in her home, and directing church musical groups, she maintained contact with students in many capacities.

Primarily, she accompanied choirs and vocal and instrumental soloists at Luverne and Hills Beaver Creek public schools.

In 2000, the LEA recognized Dolly as the 2001 "Friend of Education," for all her contributions to school music in her retirement.

"I don't miss teaching because I'm still working with students every day," Talbert told the Star Herald in 2000.

"It was just a really big honor," she said of the award. "When you're having so much fun doing what you're doing, you don't expect to be recognized."

Sandy Klosterbuer was one of the teachers who nominated Talbert for the Friend of Education Award. She studied

under Talbert as a middle school student in Luverne.

"It is my personal goal as a teacher to make a positive difference in the lives of my students just as Dolly made a positive difference in my life when I was a student," Klosterbuer said.

The Music Boosters gave

Talbert a small honorarium for her accompanying work, but Talbert said she does it for her own enjoyment. "It's a lot of fun," she said. "It takes a little time, but it's fun."

Music Boosters to match donations to Talbert Memorial Fund

Today Luverne music students will continue benefitting from Talbert through the "Dolly Talbert Memorial Scholarship," set up with Luverne Dollars for Scholars.

The Luverne Music Boosters organization will match any donations (up to \$2,000) given to Dollars for Scholars in Dolly Talbert's name.

"Dolly has been a big part of music at Luverne Public Schools for many years," said Music Boosters President Heather Johnson.

"Luverne Music Boosters felt a scholarship in her name would be the perfect way to honor her and remember her love and appreciation of music."

Donations must be received by the end of the year to qualify for the matching funds. Whenever possible, the perpetual scholarship will be awarded to Luverne seniors who participated in music during their high school years.

Luverne Dollars for Scholars ... Did you know?

Who gets scholarships and how are they awarded?

Applicants for a Luverne Dollars for Scholars award are evaluated on the following criteria: academic performance, scholastic aptitude, work experience, school activity and community involvement.

Students are also required to write an essay describing their future aspirations as well as seek a recommendation from someone, whether a teacher or an adult who has worked with the student. These applications are due each year around February 15th.

All applications are submitted through an online student profile application located on the Luverne Dollars for Scholars website.

Once all of the information is compiled, the selection process begins. Each application is assigned a number.

The Luverne High School counselor verifies each students' class rank, GPA and ACT scores. Only the application number, not the applicant name, is seen throughout the rest of the scoring. Each essay is read and scored by a group of DFS board members.

References, work experience, school activity and community involvement are cross checked against the computerized score assigned each applicant. Not all applicants receive a scholarship.

Applications who do not reach the minimum score do not qualify for a scholarship award. None of the scholarships are based on financial need. The total amount of scholarships paid out each year varies. The DFS Board uses 4.5 percent of the five-year fair market value of its fund assets as a guide when determining the total to be awarded each year.

Students who receive a scholarship award of \$4,000 or less can use it all in one year, while scholarships greater than \$4,000 are divided out over multiple years, with \$4,000 being the max that can be paid out each year.

Scholarship funds are not paid out until after the first semester of college has been completed. In order to receive their scholarship funds, students must maintain a minimum 2.0 GPA. Scholarship checks are paid directly to the school.

Luverne Dollars for Scholars wrapped up its 2023 awards season this May. Sixty seven qualifying Luverne High School students from the Class of 2023 were awarded \$523,750. These scholarships ranged from \$2,500 to \$13,000.
